ATTACHMENT 2A

ART

Thumbprint monkeys: Give each child a sheet of paper with the outline of a tree drawn on it. Set out inkpads and felt markers. Let children make thumbprint monkeys on the trees. To create monkeys, have them press thumbprints (two, one above the other, connecting) then complete the monkeys by adding faces, arms, tails

FINEMOTOR/EYE-HAND COORDINATION

Play with a Barrel of Monkeys or use the monkeys as manipulatives. You can sort by color, talk about which group is bigger, create patterns, etc.

SNACKS

Banana Splits Provide bowls of nuts, sprinkles, pineapple etc Give each child a bowl of ice cream a plastic knife and a banana. Let them create their own banana split. If the weather is warm enough I recommend this be done outside.

Monkey bread

Pillsbury bread dough 1 or 2 pkg
Butter, sugar, and cinnamon

Dab the butter over the bread dough and sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon and bake. Bake according to directions.

Monkey's Salad ---- Bananas, raisins, peanuts, and shredded coconut - - peel and slice bananas into a small dish, alternate with raisins and peanuts. Top off with shredded coconut.
